Proposal: It is proposed that faculty from the Instructional Technology and Distance Education program in the Fischler Graduate School of Education and Human Services, Nova Southeastern University complete staff development for the South Dakota Alliance for Distance Education (SDADE), South Dakota's Star Schools Project.

Activities: Staff development in distance education for teacher education faculty members at each of South Dakota's public universities will be conducted by specialists in distance education and instructional technology. These five workshops will be held in South Dakota, one at each public university with a teacher education program. Each workshop will be two days in length and will be for faculty involved in preparing students to be teachers.

Time Line: Planning for the workshops will be conducted during the summer of 2001. Faculty from the ITDE program will discuss the specifics of the staff development sessions with appropriate officials from each South Dakota University, and from the SDADE office. The workshops will be held on-campus during the fall of 2001 at a time mutually agreed on.

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
